Key Points of Discussion:

- The Report the Chief Executive Officer was circulated in the Board Meeting Materials. The following updates were presented at the meeting:
 - The LHIN has received 92 of the 96 Multi-Sector Accountability Agreements (MSAAs). The signed MSAAs are due no later than March 31, 2014. This is an improvement from last year at this time and congratulations were sent to the LHIN's Quality and Risk Management team.
 - The Hospital Service Accountability Agreement (HSAA) are also due for renewal. The Board previously approved the Board Chair and CEO to sign the extensions as long as they were substantially similar. It was confirmed that the extension is exactly the same as previously approved.
 - Congratulations were sent to Foyer Richelieu which received the business of the month award from the Welland-Pelham Chamber of Commerce.
 - Dr. Salim Yusuf, Director of Population Health Research Institute at McMaster has been awarded the Gardiner Award for leadership in global clinical trials and population studies that have shaped prevention and treatment of cardiovascular disease.
 - Norfolk General Hospital (NGH) has qualified for the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care's (Ministry's) working capital relief process. To qualify, NGH had to balance their budget for 2013-14. This item will be brought back to the Board quarterly for sign-off.

Confirmation of Funding Received

Key Points of Discussion:

- \$46M will be transferred from the HNHB LHIN to Cancer Care Ontario.
- The Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care (Ministry) is recovering funding for some provincial programs where volumes were not met.

Public Reporting of Expenses – Third Quarter (Q3)

Key Points of Discussion:

The Q3 expenses have been reviewed and have been submitted to the Ministry.

Community Care Access Centre (CCAC) Funding

Key Points of Discussion:

• The HNHB CCAC is experiencing a dramatic increase to support the discharge of patients who required greater than eight hours of care per day.

• The LHIN has identified, through in-year reallocation of community funding, an additional \$4.6 funds that can be allocated on a one-time basis. It is anticipated that the Ministry will be providing assistance for the remaining deficit.

Migrant Agricultural Workers

Key Points of Discussion:

There are approximately 8,000 migrant workers in the HNHB LHIN catchment.
 These workers are entitled to primary care; however, they rarely access it. The LHIN is working with the Community Health Centre (CHC) sector to provide greater access to primary care for this population.

Norfolk General Hospital – Recovery of Stroke Funds

That the Board of Directors of the Hamilton Niagara Haldimand Brant Local Health Integration Network approve Norfolk General Hospital to defer the transfer of \$150,000 base funding to Brant Community Health System to support the costs associated with the integration of acute stroke services at Brant Community Health System until 2014-15.

Key Points of Discussion:

 Strokes services are being transferred from Norfolk General Hospital (NGH) to Brant Community Health System (BCHS). To support the transfer NGH agreed to transfer \$150,000 to BCHS. Due to the timing of the stroke transfer, NGH was not able to realize the intended savings in 2013-14 fiscal year. If the transfer of funding was to occur, this would put NGH in a deficit position at the end of the fiscal year.

D. New/Other Business

D.1 Strategic Health System Plan (SHSP) Update

Key Points of Discussion:

- Staff presented an update on the SHSP. A copy of the presentation will be posted on the LHIN's website.
- The presentation is a report on the activities associated with year one of the SHSP.
- Health Links allows patients to drive the care they need in the health system. It is
 not building short-term solutions for a distinct group of clients but building a system
 that is sustainable and responsive to the complex/complicated needs of clients
 today and over time.
- The LHIN developed a team internally to address issues around auditor general's report regarding Diabetes. The HNHB LHIN is not unique with the issues of duplication and underutilization of diabetes services. All the Diabetes Education Programs (DEPs) are involved in a data sharing program. The DEPs have identified that there are opportunities for integrations and to reduce the barriers to access to the programs.
- The HNHB LHIN has the most number of residential hospices in Ontario. Each hospice has a bed complement of six or 10 beds, depending on the individual hospice.
- There is no cost to the individual for hospice care.
- The HNHB LHIN Palliative Care Council will review and identify where the proposed outreach teams should be located.
- The Board thanked all the people who work in palliative care, including hospice staff and volunteers and LHIN staff for their work on this initiative.

D.2 French Language Joint Annual Action Plan

E.1 Life or Limb Update Presentation

Key Points of Discussion:

- Staff presented on the Life or Limb Update. A copy of the presentation will be posted on the LHIN's website.
- The program will have physicians from small and medium sized hospitals partnered with large/tertiary hospitals. If the patient is deemed life or limb a transfer within in four hours is required.
- Patients will be transferred back to a hospital closer to home once they are deemed able.

E.2 Results of Critical Link

Key Points of Discussion:

- Staffed presented an update prepared by Dr. W. Krizmanich on the ED Critical Link Program. A copy of the presentation will be posted on the LHIN's website
- Small and medium sized Emergency Departments were paired with large/tertiary Emergency Departments for the on-going care of semi-critical patients.
- If the patient is not deemed life or limb, advice is given to physicians at the small/medium sized hospitals from physician at the large/tertiary hospital on the care for the individual.

The Board of Directors thanked the CEO and staff for their work as it helps the Board make good, informed decisions.
